# STADIUM/GAMEDAY





#### **HORNET STADIUM**

- Originally built in 1969, Hornet Stadium is the home for Sacramento State football. The facility has a capacity of 21,195 the second largest in the Big Sky Conference.
- A new playing surface was installed prior to the 2021 season. The SprinTurf surface features the yardage numbers in Sacramento State's font, the Big Sky Conference logos stitched into the field and new gold end zones. The surface also has a shock pad beneath it and an infill which is designed to reduce heat.
- Hornet Stadium has served as the home of several professional football teams including the Sacramento Surge of the World League, the Sacramento Gold Miners of the Canadian Football League and Sacramento Mountain Lions of the United Football League.
- The stadium has also hosted the 2000 and 2004 U.S. Olympic Track and Field Trials and four NCAA Div. I Outdoor Track and Field Championships (2003, 2005, 2006, 2007).
- The stadium is surrounded by The Well to the north and the Broad Athletic Fieldhouse to the south. The Well is Sacramento State's student recreation and health center. It opened in 2010 (expanded in 2021) and features a large weight room, indoor spaces for basketball, volleyball, racquetball and soccer, a rock climbing wall and an elevated running track.
- The Broad Athletic Fieldhouse is the home to Hornet football and track and field. Built in 2008, it includes coaches offices, meeting spaces, locker rooms, training rooms and weight rooms for the teams.

#### **GAMEDAY**

- The celebration of Hornet football begins well before kickoff with a lively tailgate party outside of Hornet Stadium. Fans then greet the team for Hornet Walk which includes the Sacramento State marching band, cheer and dance teams.
- Once inside, Sacramento State students sit directly behind the Hornet bench at midfield. A new VIP fan section was added in the north end zone during the 2019 season.



- Unlike last season where Sacramento State entered the year without a quarterback on the roster who had a started a game for the Hornets, the team boasts two QBs in 2024 who saw significant time on the field in Kaiden Bennett and Carson Conklin.
- Bennett appeared in all 13 games, starting 10 last season. The senior compiled 2,767 yards of total offense and accounted for 24 touchdowns while showcasing his dual-threat ability. Bennett had monster performances in two of the team's biggest victories of the season beginning with 279 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in the win at Stanford. In the NCAA FCS first round playoff game, he added 207 passing yards and 126 rushing yards with a pair of touchdowns.
- He finished the season with 2,190 passing yards while completing 64.3 percent of his passes and tossing 16 touchdowns. Bennett's completion percentage ranks second in school single-season history and was the best by a Hornet with at least 200 pass attempts during a year. He also ranked second on the team with 577 rushing yards and was third among Sacramento State players with six rushing touchdowns.
- Conklin played in the final four regular season games allowing him to preserve his redshirt status during the year. He had a memorable debut against Idaho State, completing 14-of-21 passes for 235 yards and three touchdowns. Conklin also shined against Cal Poly where he had 313 passing yards the most by a Hornet during the year and three touchdowns while completing 17-of-26 pass attempts.
- Behind the pair are a trio of quarterbacks who have yet to appear in a game for the Hornets. Jordan Barton was named the California State Offensive Player of the Year last season while guiding Riverside JC to a state title. Barton led the state with 35 touchdown passes and threw for 3,990 yards while completing 72.6 percent of his passes.
- Joey Cook redshirted in 2023. Cook graduated from Marin Catholic HS and helped his team to an appearance in the NorCal Div. 2-A title game as a senior.
- The newest member to the unit is Luke Baker who graduated from San Ramon Valley HS this past spring. Baker amassed 7,259 passing yards and 83 touchdowns during his career. As a senior, he threw for 3,347 yards and 37 touchdowns and was named the East Bay Athletic League MVP.



### RUNNING BACKS

- A trio of running backs who combined for over 150 carries and nearly 900 yards return to their Hornet backfield in 2024. Junior Elijah Tau-Tolliver is the leading returning rusher on the team having compiled 387 yards a year ago. A good chunk of that total came in a nationally-televised game against Montana State on ESPN2 where he rushed for 100 yards and scored a 53-yard touchdown. Tau-Tolliver has appeared in every Sacramento State game over the last two seasons where he has become an all-purpose standout with 1,719 combined yards rushing, receiving and on kick returns.
- Ezra Moleni appeared in nine games during his first season with the team. Moleni rushed for 278 yards on six carries and also caught five passes for 32 yards. His biggest output came in the team's win at Northern Colorado where he had 87 rushing yards and also caught an 8-yard touchdown pass. In the three games where Moleni filled in for the injured Marcus Fulcher, he averaged 58.3 yards per game.
- Zeke Burnett was the most explosive of the backs last season, averaging 8.0 yards per carry on his 27 attempts. Burnett did not receive a carry until week five where he picked up 40 yards on six attempts and scored his first career touchdown. His breakout game came against Idaho State, rushing for 143 yards on just nine attempts.
- Junior Michael Johnson and redshirt freshman Curron Borders also return to the team. Johnson was efficient in limited action last year, picking up 32 yards on four carries. He scored his first career touchdown on an 8-yard rush against Idaho State. Borders did not appear in a game in 2023 but was a three-star recruit out of Antelope HS where he ran for 3,574 yards and 50 touchdowns in three varsity seasons.
- The two newcomers in the backfield are freshmen Ajon Bryant and Ardwon Morris. Bryant was a three-star product of Mater Dei HS. He averaged nearly seven yards per carry as a senior and helped the Monarchs to a 37-2 overall record in his final three seasons. Morris comes to the Hornets from Orange HS. As a senior, he rushed for 2,486 yards which ranked second in the Southern Section and eighth in the state. He averaged 226.0 yards per game and rushed for at least 113 yards in all 11 contests.
- Though not a running back, Sacramento State did turn to tight end Coleman Kuntz near the goal line last season. Kuntz had six carries during the year for a total of 10 yards and scored four touchdowns.





### **WIDE RECEIVERS**

- Sacramento State's 2024 wide receiving corps boasts three players which caught at least 30 passes last season. The trio are part of 15 total wide receivers on the roster comprised of five returners, four redshirt freshmen, two FBS transfers and three true freshmen.
- Jared Gipson was named second team all-Big Sky a year ago after ranking second on the team with 38 receptions for 657 yards and four touchdowns. Gipson was the team's primary deep ball threat, averaging 17.3 yards per reception which led the Big Sky. He caught at least one pass in 11 games and three or more receptions in eight contests. Gipson also had a pair of 100-yard games with 154 receiving yards against Cal Poly and 108 against Northern Arizona.
- Anderson Grover finished 2023 his first with the Hornets with 34 receptions for 431 yards and three touchdowns. Grover made an immediate impact, catching a touchdown in the season opener at Nicholls. He finished the year strong with over half of his season total (262 yards) coming in the final three games of the season.
- Devin Gandy was a primary target through the first 10 games of the season until a knee injury ended his year. Gandy hauled in 33 passes for 412 yards and four touchdowns. He is expected to return to action near the start of the 2024 season.
- Sawyer Merrill and Ty Smith complete the returners while Onterrio Smith, Jr., Jayden Weber, Mekhei Byrd, Danny Scudero and Darren Gandy (Devin's younger brother) all redshirted last season. Along with playing receiver, Merrill has established himself as one of the top special teams players in the Big Sky. Scudero, arguably the fastest player on the team, appeared in four games in 2023 while maintaining his redshirt. He scored a touchdown on his first offensive touch of his career with a 16-yard rush against Montana State on ESPN2.
- Makai Cope and Joshua Nicholson both come to the Hornets from FBS teams where they were active contributors. Cope appeared in 26 games for Utah including the 2021 and 2022 Rose Bowls. Nicholson played in 18 games over the last two seasons at San Diego State. He had 17 receptions for 157 yards and a touchdown in those contests and will have two years of eligibility remaining with the Hornets.
- Kai Hamilton, Jason Auzenne and Jaythn Long are all 2024 high school graduates. Hamilton and Long were both three-star recruits by 247Sports while Auzenne was a two-star product.



### OFF. LINE/TIGHT ENDS

- Two-time first team all-Big Sky selection Jackson Slater leads an experienced offensive line. Slater has started 36 consecutive games for the Hornets with the majority coming at left guard. He became just the second offensive lineman in school history to earn back-to-back first team all-Big Sky accolades a year ago. The 6-4, 316-pounder has power cleaned 415 pounds, back squatted 635 pounds and has been clocked at 19.96 miles per hour.
- Nathan Mejia was named second team all-Big Sky in 2022 and followed with honorable mention last year. Mejia has started all 26 games at center the last two years.
- Kenndel Riley (eight career starts) and Kaden Richardson (six) both bring experience on the interior of the line. Riley has mostly played right guard while Richardson has seen action at guard and center.
- Aidan Meek started nine games in 2023 at right tackle and the junior is expected to return to the starting lineup this year.
- Other returners include junior Sawyer Hays, sophomores Brandon Sousa and Justin Davis and redshirt freshmen Cade Gretlein, Davis May, Jose Soto and Richard McKay.
- Transfers Bryson Summers (Coastal Carolina), Joey Wright (San Diego State and TangiTangi Pongia (UTEP) as well as a pair of junior college transfers and true freshmen complete the unit.
- Junior Coleman Kuntz is the most experienced of the returning tight ends as he started seven games in 2023 and finished the year with 20 receptions for 236 yards. Kuntz had played behind All-American Marshel Martin for the majority of his first two seasons but stepped into a starting role last season when the three-time first team all-Big Sky selection was injured.
- Austin Jarrard is the only other tight end to catch a pass as a Hornet.
   Jarrard's first career reception at Sacramento State was a touchdown last season at Idaho.
- Jay Rudolph played in 30 games at San Diego State, including 12 starts.
   He was primarily used as a blocking tight end but did have nearly 20 career receptions, including a touchdown against Utah.
- Redshirt freshman Jayden Flaig will be joined by junior college transfer Gavin Nelson and true freshmen Kyle Koontz and Tommy Poe.







### **DEFENSIVE LINE**

- A common theme on the Hornet defense this year will be the need to replace last season's starters. This proves true on the defensive line where all
  four primary starters from 2023 are no longer with the program. However,
  there are plenty options for the team as five players return after seeing
  significant time in the rotation a year ago.
- The interior of the line will include senior Brandon Knott and juniors Xavier Williams and Mason Brosseau. Knott has been a key cog for the team up front over the three previous seasons where he has been credited with 71 total tackles, including 3.5 for loss and three sacks.
- Williams finished 2023 with 14 total tackles in 12 games. Nine of those stops came in the final four games of the year, including a career best four tackles against UC Davis in the Causeway Classic.
- Brosseau has the ability to also play on the edge and has shown a knack to get to the quarterback. Last year, he had 12 tackles with three sacks and added three quarterback hurries.
- Josh Cashiola and Ben Ahio were both part of the rotation at defensive end during the 2023 season. Cashiola led all returning defensive linemen with 27 total tackles last year. His total included 4.5 for loss and two sacks. Cashiola began his collegiate career at San Diego as a safety and then moved to linebacker at Fresno City JC before finding a spot up front.
- Ahio played in all 13 games, starting two at defensive end. He was credited with 16 total tackles including 1.5 sacks. Ahio also intercepted a pass in the NCAA FCS Playoffs against North Dakota.
- Senior Pate Haunga and sophomore Tyler Henry will compete for a spot in the rotation at defensive tackle. Each saw limited action a year ago in their first active season with the team.
- On the edge, the returners include Fata Puloka who played nickelback and linebacker during his redshirt season in 2023 and Will Schalde who's a converted tight end. Riley Hernandez also returns after missing all of 2023 with an injury. Redshirt freshmen Kyle Stahlecker completes the list of defensive linemen who were with the team a year ago.
- The newcomers include Abilene Christian transfer Colby Warkentin, junior college transfer Elijah Hansen and true freshmen Jordan Snowden, Jayland McGlothen and Spencer Patton.

### LINEBACKERS

- The team's leading tackler from 2023, two of the top three and three of the top eight were all linebackers and each graduated from the program following the season.
- The blow will be softened by the addition of Will Leota who transferred from Utah Tech and will be reunited with linebackers coach Misi Tupe. Leota earned first team all-WAC honors in 2022 and was a second team all-league choice in 2021 and 2023. During his time with the Trailblazers, he tallied 213 career tackles which ranked sixth in school history. Last season, he recorded 75 total stops, including four for loss and also had an interception.
- The only player on the roster who has a started a game at linebacker for the Hornets is junior Oge Feo (one start). Feo has been a stalwart on special teams the last two years, appearing in every game and recording 20 tackles in his career.
- Junior Mitchell Wolfe and sophomores Nakian Jackson and Hunter Boeddeker have each seen action on the field. Wolfe has 13 tackles in his two seasons. His 2023 campaign was highlighted by an interception against Idaho State as well as a career-high four tackles at South Dakota in the second round of the FCS Playoffs.
- Jackson played in the first nine games of the year before a thumb injury ended his season. He was credited with 15 total tackles during the year and had at least one stop in eight of his nine games.
- Junior college transfers Matthew Eskridge II, Amarian Hunter and Caleb Chennault will add a veteran presence to the unit. Eskridge won a state title at Riverside JC and was named third team All-America by JC Gridwire. Hunter and Chennault are both Central Valley products having played at Reedley JC and College of Sequoias, respectively.
- Alex Rocha, who missed the majority of last season with an injury and redshirt freshman Derek Houston round out the returners at linebacker.
- Other newcomers include James Tivao, Jerome Roberts and Chase Jackson. Tivao was a three-star recruit from Madison HS in San Diego where he tallied 271 career tackles. Roberts graduated high school early and took part in spring practice with the Hornets. While at Lincoln HS in San Diego he made 171 tackles as a senior and was named the Western League Defensive Player of the Year. Jackson was a three-star recruit from Damien HS and was twice named all-league.





### DEFENSIVE BACKS

- With 23 defensive backs on the roster, there are plenty of options for Sacramento State to fill the five starting positions in 2024. Senior Gavin Davis-Smith is the only returner who started multiple games a year ago for the team. Davis-Smith earned the starting nod at nickelback in seven games and ended the season at free safety. He finished the season with 65 total tackles which placed him fourth on the team and is the most among returners this year.
- Zelmar Vedder and Patrick Dean have both started games at cornerback for the team. Vedder played in all 13 games last season, starting the two FCS playoff games. During the year, he recorded 14 total tackles. Dean has 28 appearances during his three previous seasons.
- The cornerback position also features several players who were with the team last season. DJ Houston has played in every game over the last two years. Jason Oliver redshirted during the season after transferring from Colorado. Sacramento native Lamont Johnson-Burrell played in 10 games in 2023 and was poised to start late in the season until he was injured in practice. Sophomores Daizon Allen and Ellias Mullican have also been with the program for two years.
- Newcomers to the unit are true freshmen Phoenix Rose and Adam Taylor and Lewis & Clark transfer Steven Keene who returns to his hometown.
- Veterans Eian Moore and Davion Ross return to the team at safety to provide some leadership to the secondary. Moore arrived on campus in 2020 only to have the Hornets opt not to play, he then redshirted in 2021 due to an injury which limited him to the final three games. He played in 12 games, starting four, in 2022 where he head 39 total tackles but missed all of last season with injury. Ross redshirted in 2018, played in eight games in 2019 and seven in 2021. He missed all of 2022 with a knee injury and 2023 due to a ruptured Achilles tendon.
- Transfer Murvin Kennion III is familiar with the Big Sky having played the last two seasons at Idaho where he had 53 tackles and four interceptions.
- Other returners include Kaleb Higgins and Anta'Veon McKenzie who each started at least one game last season, Koa Akui and Xander Chisolm.
- At nickelback, Davis-Smith will be joined by junior college transfers Malini Ti'a and Amari Roberson, Fresno State transfer Jalen Williams and Cal transfer Dejuan Butler.



### **SPECIALISTS**

- The Hornets specialists are fully stocked from a year ago with the return
  of long snapper AJ Campos, kicker Zach Schreiner and punter Cal McGough. The unit also returns its top kick and punt returners as well as its
  leading special teams tackler.
- Schreiner had a fantastic debut season for the team as he made 14 field goals and was a perfect 49-of-49 on extra points. His field goal total was the third highest in school history and he became just the second Hornet kicker to not have a missed PAT with at least 40 attempts. Schreiner was named the Big Sky Special Teams Player of the Week after making field goals of 24, 22 and 44 yards in the win at Stanford.
- McGough followed being named to the all-Big Sky third team in 2022 with honorable mention in 2023. Last season, he averaged 42.86 yards per punt which was the fifth-highest mark in school single-season history. He had seven punts of at least 50 yards and landed 50 percent of his kicks inside the opponent 20-yard line.
- Campos has started every game at long snapper over the past two seasons. He has remained perfect on punt and kick attempts during his career.
- Evan Kiely returns for his second season with the team and will be joined by true freshman Isaac Espinoza at kicker. Fellow freshman Dawit Crain will battle for the punting job and could also serve as a kickoff specialist. Junior college transfer Adam Johnston (Modesto JC) will compete for an opportunity at long snapper.
- Through two seasons, Elijah Tau-Tolliver has cemented himself as one of the best kick returners in school history. Tau-Tolliver enters the season ranked third in the Hornet record book in kick return average (25.07 ypr), is sixth in total kick return yards (1,053) and seventh in kick return attempts (42). Last season, he averaged 23.0 yards per return with a long of 44 yards. Redshirt freshman Danny Scudero could join Tau-Tolliver for kick returners in 2024. Scudero had three attempts last season with a long of 29 yards.
- Anderson Grover was the team's primary punt returner during his first season. Grover had 17 returns with an average of 7.1 yards per attempt and a long of 36 yards.
