



 Brennan Marion was named the 13th head football coach at Sacramento State on Dec. 21, 2024.

#### **AT UNLV**

- One of the top offensive coordinators in the country, Marion came to the Hornets after spending two seasons at UNLV (2023-24).
- Under his watch, the Rebels had great success, posting a 19-8 overall record and qualifying for a pair of bowl games.
- In 2024, UNLV ranked 14th in the FBS with a school-record setting average of 36.2 points per game. The team's average of 251.2 rushing yards per game would also be the most for the school in over 45 years. For his efforts, Marion was named one of five finalists for the Football Scoop Offensive Coordinator of the Year.
- In Marion's "Go-Go" offense, five UNLV offensive players earned either first or second team all-Mountain West in 2024. That included WR Ricky White III, who became the first player in school history to post two 1,000-yard seasons, and Hajj-Malik Williams, who became just the second Rebel quarterback since 1996 to be named either first or second team all-league.
- Following the 2023 season, Marion earned the Mountain West Wire Coordinator of the Year honor and was a nominee for the prestigious Broyles Award in just his first season at UNLV.
- During the season, the team scored 40+ points in a school-record six games and had 24 points in a school-record 10 straight games.
- The Rebels finished sixth in the FBS in third-down conversions (49.3 percent), tied for eighth in redzone offense (93.1 percent) and 22nd in scoring (34.4 ppg).
- UNLV was the Mountain West regular season co-champion and boasted a first team All-American in wide receiver Ricky White III, a Mountain West Freshman of the Year in quarterback Jayden Maiava and a rookie who led the nation among all freshmen in rushing touchdowns with 12 in Jai'Den Thomas as part of a school-record 39 overall rushing scores.

#### **AT TEXAS**

 Marion came to UNLV from Texas where he served the 2022 season as the passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach. The Longhorns finished with a top 25 scoring offense (34.5 PPG) while Marion tutored Big 12 Conference receiving touchdowns leader Xavier Worthy, who became the 28th overall pick in the 2024 NFL Draft by the Kansas City Chiefs.

#### **AT PITT**

Marion coached 2021 Biletnikoff Award winner Jordan Addison at Pittsburgh. The nation's top wideout was a consensus first team All-American after setting a school single-season record with 100 catches for 1,593 yards and an FBS-leading 17 touchdowns. He would become a first round NFL Draft pick by the Minnesota Vikings.





#### **AT HAWAII**

- Served as wide receivers coach at Hawaii in 2020.
- Oversaw the development of all-Mountain West receiver Calvin Turner who was named the New Mexico Bowl Most Outstanding Offensive Player after compiling 252 all-purpose yards and scoring two touchdowns in the Rainbow Warriors' 28-14 win over Houston.

#### **AT WILLIAM & MARY**

- In 2019, Marion was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at William & Mary, where he dramatically improved the Tribe's production in every major statistical category.
- The Tribe nearly doubled its scoring average while its total offensive output increased by almost 100 yards per contest.

#### AT HOWARD

- First NCAA Div. I coaching opportunity came at Howard, where he posted two exceptional seasons (2017-18) as the Bisons' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.
- In 2017, quarterback Caylin Newton was named the MEAC Rookie of the Year after becoming the first freshman in conference history to surpass 3,000 vards of total offense (3.185).
- Marion's offense sparked Howard to a 7-4 record in 2017, including a memorable 43-40 win over UNLV — the largest upset in college football history.

#### AT PORTLAND STATE

- No stranger to the Big Sky Conference, Patterson had two stints at Portland State, including serving as the Vikings' assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and running backs coach.
- In 2023, Patterson's offense averaged 33.8 points per game and ranked fifth in the nation in rushing at 224.0 yards per game — the most by a PSU team in seven seasons.
- The following season, the team averaged 29.3 ppg and 203.2 rushing ypg. Dante Chachere was one of the top dual-threat quarterbacks in the FCS, finishing the year with 1,970 passing yards and 723 rushing yards while accounting for 24 touchdowns.
- Known for his recruiting acumen, Patterson has played a vital role in the Vikings' outstanding signing classes prior to the 2023 and 2024 seasons. PSU's 2023 class was rated number one in the Big Sky and third in the nation by 247Sports.com. The following year, Patterson was named the top recruiter in the FCS and Big Sky Conference by 247Recruiting.
- When Patterson was originally hired at Portland State in 2015, he was the youngest (22) Division I football coach in the country. During his first two years at PSU Patterson produced quality offensive line play that had been a standard at Portland State for many years. Those two seasons ranked among the top four rushing performances in PSU history.
- Four Viking starters earned all-Big Sky Conference honors in 2015. Tackle Kyle Smith was named second team, tackle Mike Davis and guard/center Cam Keizur were named to the third team, and guard Randin Crecelius earned honorable mention. In 2016, Keizer was named first team, Crecelius earned third team and Tyshon Mosley was named honorable mention all-Big Sky.
- In 2017, Patterson moved over to assist in coaching running backs. In 2018, Patterson took over as tight ends coach and the all-important responsibility of recruiting coordinator. Patterson guided Charlie Taumoepeau to all-conference and All-American honors.

- Served as the cornerbacks coach at Colorado State from 2022-24.
- In his first season at CSU, his group helped the Rams rank third in the conference in pass defense efficiency at 111.11.
- Chigozie Anusiem led the corners, tying for the team lead with nine passes defended on his way to all-Mountain West honorable mention honors.
- In 2024, Dom Jones earned honorable mention all-Mountain West. That season, Jones posted 61 total tackles to go along with a pair of interceptions and eight pass breakups.
- Colorado State finished the regular season with an 8-4 overall record and went 6-1 in the MWC. The team advanced to the Snoop Dogg Arizona Bowl.

#### AT TARLETON STATE

- · Led Tarleton's first NCAA Div. I campaign in the unprecedented spring football season of 2021. The Texans went 5-3 in their first season at the FCS level and earned their first win over a Division I program against FBS Independent New Mexico State.
- The Texans allowed just 16.4 points per game and only 300 yards per contest in 2018.
- The team won its first outright Lonestar Conference title and advanced to the NCAA regional finals with a 12-1 record and a No. 5 national ranking.
- The Texan defense recorded 17 interceptions, allowed 101.2 rushing yards per game and had 33 sacks in 13 games. The defense also posted two shutouts.
- Coached three All-Americans in Devin Hafford (CB). Tyrell Thompson (DT) and Jai Edwards (FS) and a pair of defenders who went on to the NFL in linebacker
- EJ Speed, who was drafted in the fifth round of the 2019 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts, the highest draft pick in program history, and Tyrell Thompson, who signed a free agent deal with the Los Angeles

Rams and was later drafted into the XFL.

- In 2019, he helped Tarleton to another undefeated regular season and LSC Championship. Under Patton's leadership, Tarleton boasted the LSC Defensive Player of the Year (B.J. Jefferson), LSC Defensive Lineman of the Year (Jordan Wells), and LSC Defensive Back of the Year (Prince Robinson).
- · He coached Tarleton's Cody Burtscher to one of the most decorated seasons by a single player in school history as the senior was named first-team All-LSC, All-Region, AFCA All-America, and the Lone Star Conference Linebacker of the Year in 2017. Patton's defense also boasted EJ Speed, who earned second-team honors and led the nation in forced fumbles, as well as honorable mention all-LSC players Dominique Martin, Chase Varnado, Basil Jackson, and Treston Ridge.

- Returned to Sacramento State to serve as co-defensive coordinator/inside linebackers coach in January of 2025.
- Coached a pair of FCS All-Americans and first team all-Big Sky selections during his first tenure with the Hornets (2007-08).
- Cyrus Mulitalo was an All-American both seasons and left the school ranked third with 326 career tackles.
   Mike Brannon was a two-time first team all-Big Sky selection and named All-America in 2007.

• Named the team's cornerbacks coach and defensive pass game coordinator in December of 2024.

#### **AT ALBANY**

- Coached at Albany for four years, beginning as a cornerbacks coach before adding co-defensive coordinator responsibilities.
- Helped the Great Dane defense enjoy a historic season in 2023, en route to the team's first-ever NCAA FCS semifinal appearance and first ever CAA title.
- The UAlbany defense paced the entire country in rushing defense, allowing an FCS low of 87.6 yards per game and just 11 rushing touchdowns.
- In the CAA, the Great Danes allowed the fewest yards per play (4.9), the third-fewest yards per game (322.5), and the third-fewest touchdowns (33).
- Tight coverage in Walls' secondary allowed the defensive line to thrive, finishing with 50 sacks on the year.
- The secondary itself had a strong season, picking up 17 interceptions over 15 games. All-American Amir Hall led the group with five interceptions, finishing in a tie for the fourth most in the entire FCS.

#### **AS A PLAYER**

- Played six seasons in the NFL as a cornerback.
- Was signed by the Atlanta Falcons as an undrafted free agent in 2011 after playing college football at Notre Dame.
- In 2011, Walls signed with the New York Jets. He was activated from the practice squad on November 22, and made his Jets debut that evening during a nationally-televised Thanksgiving Day game against the division-rival New England Patriots at MetLife Stadium.
- He played in six games that season, mostly on special teams, and made his first career start in the finale against Buffalo.
- A full-time starter at right cornerback in 2014, Walls led the Jets with 12 passes defended and co-led the team with two interceptions.
- Following the 2015 season, Walls signed a one-year contract with the Detroit Lions in 2016 before transitioning to coaching.

- Played four seasons at Notre Dame where he appeared in 45 games, starting 34.
- Finished his career with 104 total tackles with 3.5 for loss.
- Enters 2025 tied for sixth in school history with two interceptions for touchdowns and is tied for eighth with 20 career pass breakups.
- A second-team high school All-American out of Woodland Hills HS in Pittsburgh, Pa.

 Joined the Sacramento State coaching staff in December of 2024 at the team's special teams coordinator.

#### **AT MINNESOTA**

- Served as the special teams coordinator at Minnesota from 2017-24.
- The Gophers ranked second in the nation in punt return defense in 2018 (1.11) and 2019 (0.17) and led the nation in 2018 in punt returns with an average of 22.25.
- Kicker Emmit Carpenter left Minnesota as the most accurate kicker (79.1%) in school history and is the school's second all-time leading scorer (276 points).
- Punter Ryan Santoso, who made his NFL debut in 2019 with the Tennessee Titans as a kick-off specialist, averaged 43.0 yards per punt in 2017 at Minnesota.
- Punter Jacob Herbers punted 93 times in 2018-19 and put only two balls in the end zone for a touchback. He placed 37 punts (39.7%) inside the 20 and 46 punts (49.4%) were fair caught.
- In 2020, Minnesota did not record any touchbacks and 12 of the team's 27 punts were inside the 20. In addition, 11 of the 27 punts were fair caught.
- In 2019, freshmen Michael Lantz made 8-of-11 field goals, was second on the team in scoring with 71 points and his 47 PATs were the second most in school history in a single season.
- Coached the Golden Gophers rush ends form 2020-24. Boye Mafe and Esezi Otomewa were selected in the second and fifth rounds, respectively, in the 2021 NFL Draft. That year marked the first time since 1958 that two Minnesota defensive linemen were selected in the same draft.

#### AT WESTERN MICHIGAN

- Worked at Western Michigan from 2013-16.
- In 2016, Darius Phillips was named MAC Special Teams Player of the Year. Phillips returned a kickoff and punt for a touchdown in 2016, a feat he accomplished in three straight seasons. Punters James Coleman and Derrick Mitchell combined to average 40.68 yards on only 44 punts. Butch Hampton, made 19-of-24 field goals, which included a season-long

47-yarder. Hampton, who was a Freshman All-American, totaled 128 points (19 FGs and 71 PATs) to set the all-time, single-season points record in the MAC.

- In 2015, Wenger saw two of his players recognized by the MAC for their breakout seasons, as Phillips earned second-team honors as a kick returner and Andrew Haldeman was named third-team as a place kicker.
- In 2014, punter J. Schroeder was named third team all-MAC, while Phillips was named a Sporting News Freshman All-American and led the conference in kick return yards and average at 26.1.



- Kris Richardson was hired as Sacramento State's Assistant Head Coach and Offensive Line Coach in January of 2019. He was elevated to Associate Head Coach/Run Game Coordinator in December of 2022.
- During Richardson's first season, the Hornets went 9-4 overall, earned a share of the Big Sky Conference title and advanced to the FCS Playoffs for the first time in school history.
- His offensive line was led by Wyatt Ming and Nick Bianco who both earned all-conference honors. Ming, who was a first team selection at center, went on to play in the Hula Bowl All-Star Game.
- The unit surrendered just 16 sacks during the season and ranked among the top 10 in the FCS in sacks allowed per pass attempt. Additionally, the team rushed for 2,201 yards and amassed 6,033 yards of total offense.
- In 2021, the line was anchored by center Thomas Parker who was a first team all-Big Sky selection and earned All-America honors.
- Kooper Richardson (Kris' son) and Brandon Weldon also earned second team all-Big Sky.
- In 2022, Richardson's offensive line had four players earn all-Big Sky accolades with guards Jackson Slater and Weldon being named to the first team and tackle Troy Stiefel and center Nathan Mejia landing on the second team.
- The unit featured six different starters and paved the way to the team being the seventh-ranked rushing offense in the FCS and ranked third in total offense.
- Sacramento State averaged 5.41 yards per rush during the year and set the school record in rushing yards in a season with 3,163 yards while allowing just 16 sacks in 13 games.
- The following year, Richardson coached three offensive linemen to all-Big Sky honors. Slater returned to the first team and joined Jon Osterhout (1998-99) as the only offensive linemen in school history to earn the honor in consecutive years. Left tackle Ivan Garza and center Nathan Mejia each earned honorable mention.
- Despite starting eight players on the line during the year, the unit combined to surrender just 16 sacks in 13 games.
- In 2024, Richardson coached Jackson Slater to first

- team all-Big Sky accolades for the third consecutive season making him the first offensive lineman in school history to do so.
- Slater competed at the Senior Bowl and NFL Combine before being drafted by the Tennessee Titans in the fifth round.
- Throughout the season, the offensive line battled injuries and were forced to start nine different players. Despite the heavy rotation, the unit responded by allowing just 14 sacks in 12 games.

- Richardson came to the Hornets after serving on the Folsom High School staff for 24 years, including his final 14 as the varsity head coach.
- The Bulldogs posted a 162-27-1 record under his leadership and became one of the most dominant programs in area history.
- From 2010-18, Folsom went 127-10 with nine league titles, seven Sac-Joaquin Section Championships and four state crowns.
- His teams won the CIF Div. 1-AA titles in 2017 and 2018.
- Following the 2017 season, Richardson was named the Cal-Hi Football Coach of the Year.

I schools during his tenure including quarterbacks Jake Browning (Washington) and Dano Graves (Cal Poly), safety Jordan Richards (Stanford/New England Patriots/Atlanta Falcons), offensive lineman Jonah Williams (Alabama/Cincinnati Bengals) and wide receiver Joe Ngata (Clemson).

- The team started the season with a 14-0 loss at De La Salle but won its final 14 games and finished the year ranked 17th nationally by MaxPreps.
